DuPage Veterans Stand Down

August 20 – 21, 2015. It's still at the DuPage County Fairgrounds. We're always looking for volunteers to be part of one of our committees or volunteering at the event. Current Congressional House Bills:

H.R. 3833 – Caregivers Expansion Act – Extends to all veterans with a serious service-connected injury the eligibility to participate in the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) program of comprehensive assistance to family caregivers of such veterans. Under current law, such eligibility is limited to those veterans who incurred such an injury on or after September 11, 2001. This will include all Veterans pre and post 9-11.

H.R. 969 – Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2015 – This Act will include Blue Water Personnel who were on a ship off the coast of Vietnam (territorial seas) for purposes of the presumption of service connection for diseases associated with exposure by veterans to certain herbicide agents while in Vietnam.

H.R. 2123 – Enhancing Veteran's Access to Treatment Act – Currently the VA is only allowed to give medication that is on their approved list to Veterans. When a Veteran leaves active duty and if he was receiving medication while on active duty, but that medication is not on the approved VA list, the VA will give a substitute medication to the Veteran. This Act will allow the VA to give the medication to the Veteran that he was receiving while on active duty.

Illinois Secretary of State:

This July, Veterans will be able to put Veteran on their driver's license. They have to take their DD-214 to one of the driver's facilities and that along with the application will be sent to the Illinois Department of Veteran's Affairs for Veteran verification. Once the verification is complete, the Veteran will receive his driver's license.
